# Old Testament Survey: HOSEA

**Author:** Hosea (Name means"Jehovah is salvation" His place of birth is unknown. Probably from Israel as he demonstrates great familiarity with that land and calls the king of Israel "our" king in 7:5.)

**Date:** 760-715 (Verse 1 says that the word of the LORD came to Hosea during the reigns of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, & Hezikiah in Judah, and Jeroboam II in Israel. Contemporary prophets were Amos and Jonah in Israel, and Micah and Isaiah in Judah).

Biblical Context: 2 Kings 14:23-18:12

**Theme:** <u>Loyal Love</u>: God's loyal love toward an unfaithful people (Written to Israel) Hosea's message contains much condemnation of the people's multiplied sins - lying, murder, insincerity, ingratitude, idolatry, covetousness, etc., but it also gives hope for the future with messages of consolation. The love of God toward His people is portrayed by the typological example of Hosea and Gomer.

# **Setting:**

Hosea prophecies over a long time period. Under Jeroboam II, Israel had expanded and was materially prosperous (to which most of the prophecies were directed), but they were morally decadent. Four of Israel's last six kings were assassinated by their successor. Judah was also in decline. Uzziah had tried to usurp the priestly function and had been struck with leprosy (2 Chr. 26:16f), Jotham condoned idolatrous practices opening the way for Baal worship (2 Chr. 27:1f), Hezekiah's revival slowed the rate of decline so that Judgment temporarily withheld.
