Cross References

1) Word cross References. The same word (or a cognate) used in more than one Scripture verse

Some verbal cross references are apparent, but not real. Remember that a word can have a different meaning in a different context and sometimes one English word is used to translate multiple Hebrew or Greek words - as in the case of "love."
